## Christmas is coming, but first...

Only 88 days till Christmas! Significantly fewer until the start of the holy season of Advent and our Advent Carol Service on the evening of Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> November. This year, the usual sequence of readings and music will be enlivened by something a little different: the premier of a new composition for voices, dancers and organ - conceived by a small creative team drawn largely from St Paul's, with music composed by Tom Hyde and

choreography by Hubert Essakow. Anthony Vernon is the coordinator of the project.

Project 'O' is about a performance; but it is about a whole lot more than just that. It is an invitation to enter – virtually – into a creative journey that began before the summer and which will culminate in

Advent Sunday evening's performance. The aim? To answer some fascinating questions we usually don't ever get to explore. How do composers compose? What sorts conversations do creative artists have? How does a commission begin, and how does it evolve along the way? And what are the similarities between the way a composer, a choreographer and a musical performer think? Usually, in an age of commodified culture, all of this stuff happens out of sight and we simply expect to turn up on the night to 'consume' the final performance. This

project lifts the veil on a creative process, from beginning to end.

Why 'O'? The ancient 'O' Advent antiphons are the project's jumping-off point, a series of seven short reflective texts originally written to be sung alongside the Magnificat on the evenings of the Advent season. Each — as Fr Nick Mercer explains in a seminar you can watch online — invites a bit of freely-associative thinking and theological reflection

on the mystery of the Incarnation and our salvation in the midst of texts that are probably overfamiliar. If you have sung 'O come, O come Emmanuel' then you already know at least one of the texts — and there are six (or seven) others too.

# NEW ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF MUSIC APPOINTED



We're glad, this week, to be able to announce the appointment of Michael **Papadopoulos** as Assistant Director of Music in succession to Jeremy Cole. Michael to St Paul's comes Knightsbridge having completed a Masters at

the Royal Academy of Music, where he took first place in the Eric Thiman Prize and was awarded the Stephen Bicknell Award. He has held posts at St Albans Cathedral, Trinity and Exeter Colleges, Oxford, and St Mark's Regent's Park. He read Music at Trinity College Oxford. At school he was awarded the ABRSM's Gold Bursary as well as the Sheila Mossman Prize, and was nominated for a Young Haringey Hero Award. He became a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists in 2013. Aside from the organ, he works singers regularly with instrumentalists as a pianist and conductor, recently founding the Ranleigh Chamber Orchestra, whose members are taken from London's conservatoires.

We look forward to him taking up his appointment on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> October.




