# The Second Sunday of Lent 21st February 2016

'In a word...'

The late Cardinal Heenan was asked to sum up in one word what Catholicism meant to him. He answered 'Authority'. The Dominican theologian Herbert McCabe writes an arresting response, 'This, to my mind, is the remark of someone who had

probably never fully experienced the relationship of love, of love between equals who someone had perhaps ignored, systematically ignored, the glimpses of love that must have been present to him during his life. Such a man wants to be a kindly benevolent ruler or a willingly obedient subject. He wants life to conducted in rational and friendly way. He wants to adjust things so that there shall be no scenes. And, if possible, he wants nothing to happen for

the first time. But love is closely connected with things happening for the first time, with creativity and radical newness.'

We cannot tell if Cardinal Heenan would have recognized himself in McCabe's description, but far more pressing is the question do we recognize ourselves? Our attempts to find the right language of God often feels like grappling with fog and yet there are things we feel we have to say about God if we are to take our bearings in the confusions of life. We say with confidence that God loves us and yet a little digging beneath the surface reveals that what we often believe God to be is a 'kindly

> benevolent ruler'. I want to say that God is the reality beneath all of our language and is the source of our freedom. Of course all language is provisional, but God's holding us in being isn't dependent on understanding of him. In the life of Jesus our picture of God grows up. No longer are we just creatures but we receive a summons to fullness of none other than sharing the life of the

Trinity.

What this actually looks like and how it shapes us and the world around will be revealed in its good time. For today, at least, the invitation of Lent is to remove the barriers and allow God back in. We have the tangible hope of witnessing something happening for the first time.




## **BOOKS FOR LENT**


