

Death, execution and martyrdom

On the morning of **Saturday 13th May** there is the opportunity to join in our latest London Exploration – just a short distance from St Paul's at the top end of Hyde Park, near to Marble Arch. Tyburn was the site of 'The King's Gallows' from 1196 to 1783. It was thus the one-way destination for six centuries for every kind of criminal. Experts reckon that during that period some 50,000 people met their death there, and for all sorts of reasons.

In the minds of churchpeople, the place is most notable for the deaths of the Tyburn Martyrs in the 16th and 17th centuries – Catholics who were executed for upholding their faith in a religiously hostile world. Among the most famous was the great Jesuit Edmund Campion. This week we remember the English martyrs of the Reformation Era at mass on Thursday.

Close to the site of the martyrs' deaths stands now the Tyburn Convent – a place of perpetual prayer and the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. There will be a chance to learn about the history of the place and for those who wish to visit and to pray together in the Convent which is open to the public.

It is salutary to think about where the boundaries lie in our minds between lawful execution and martyrdom and between reasonable faith and extremism – as a way of engaging history, but also of thinking about life in the early 21st century in a London in which 'fanatics' and 'terrorists' apparently motivated by an absolute faith are prepared, even enthusiastic, to embrace death for their causes. Extremism & conformity; difference & dispute; tolerance & fear. Join us to explore, learn, ponder and pray. Details overleaf.
