The inner city of God

Last week clergy from across the two cities of London and Westminster gathered in the iconic Rothschild Sky Garden near Cannon Street (pictured). We listened to a number of presentations on how the Church engages with the planning process in a city which is constantly adapting and changing.

There are huge issues to consider. The tragedy of the Grenfell Tower fire has concentrated our minds on the unacceptable gap between provision for the poorest and richest in our city community. It causes us to ask again the age-old question posed by the Church: who is my neighbour?

In just over a week's time we will welcome a group of pilgrims from our link diocese in Mozambique. One of the gifts that flows from developing a relationship with the church overseas is the different perspective we can learn from fellow Christians.

Monica Furlong, a contemporary Anglican visionary, touches upon such questions in her poem entitled 'My Neighbour':

'I am glad You made my neighbour different from me:

A different coloured skin, A different shaped face;

A different response to you.

I need my neighbour to teach me about You;

She knows all the things I don't know.'

The work of the Gospel in this city is shaped by the vision of the heavenly city, the rumour of which is enfleshed in countless ways across London. We too seek to play our part in being faithful to the high calling placed upon us here in Belgravia.



The work of the inner city of God doesn't resign itself to the status quo and resists the temptation to suggest easy solutions which may placate one section of the community, but have unintended consequences.

We have a wealth of buildings and a community of diverse and gifted people whom, when brought together, offer the kindly hospitality of God and prayerful resistance.

Many people have spoken of tensions and unease. The Church has been present in this city for many generations and it too continues to evolve and grow to respond to present times. In the midst of all we are seeking to make sense of is the voice of one who says to us, "Behold, I make all things new."

If you possess an iPhone or Android mobile 'phone you may be interested in installing an app called 'Pray as you go.' It's produced by the Jesuits in the UK and is a simple and userfriendly introduction to lectio diving – a form of prayer which consists of reflecting on a short passage of scripture. It can be used at the beginning or ending of the day, on the journey to work or during a lunch break. The app also contains a useful guide to the daily examen, which many people have found a useful aid to deepening their awareness of God's presence in their daily lives.
