Listening for the unheard voice

Thank you to everyone who contributed to making Fr Alfredo and Ivan so welcome on their recent visit to London. Our friends from Mozambique had a wonderful time meeting a variety of people, exploring the sights and learning more about the work of the Church across the city.

Our link with the people of All Saints Nhamavila is enriching. Hopefully we have left behind outdated Western attitudes of First and Third World categories and are freed up to explore the gifts of solidarity, partnership and cooperation.

The outworking of our common baptism brings us into the company of Jesus and wherever Jesus is found we will be in for a few surprises. You can't follow Jesus without sharing the company of those whom Jesus also calls to follow. But where is Jesus to be found?

The Eucharist teaches us to listen for the unheard voice. History is told primarily from the perspective of the powerful, but the Eucharist tells the story from the perspective of the victim – Jesus, the forgiving victim. And what is so transformative about the particular way in which this story is told is the absence of any resentment.

So whose stories are we not hearing? Who are the people who we overlook or who we don't even realise we are overlooking? Many of you will be familiar with The Passage next to Westminster Cathedral. This place of hospitality and healing was founded by Cardinal Hume in the hope that the dignity of each person would be



honoured and the image of Christ in each person would be recognised. Ivan, Fr Alfredo and I were shown around by the Chaplain, Fr Pdraig (above) and saw for ourselves the remarkable breadth of its work. We happened to visit on a day when the Goring Hotel was providing training in the hospitality industry for clients who are currently homeless or who have recently experienced homelessness.

I cannot see how its possible for the Church to faithfully fulfil its calling to be the Church unless it is in a position to listen to peoples stories both at home and abroad – moving beyond seeing people in difficult situations as merely the objects of charity. All of our encounters are transformed when we understand each person has a story to tell.

Whose story are we not hearing and are we open to having our landscapes enlarged by those who story differs from our own?


