From the cradle to the cross

Many years ago I was sent a Christmas card depicting a single lit candle. Among all the beautiful scenes on the different cards I received the simplicity of this candle was arresting. It wasn't until I read the back of the card that I discovered the picture was in fact a detail from a much larger picture I was already familiar with, namely Christ before the High Priest by Gerrit van Honthorst on display in the National Gallery.

'And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not'. Familiar words from the opening of St John's Gospel resonant of the Christmas masses. Yet in this painting the words find their context not in the wonder of the nativity scene, but in an atmosphere of suspicion and persecution in a make-shift courtroom The high priest points his finger at Jesus whose hands are bound with ropes and whose gaze is fixed upon the one who accuses.

That Christmas card gave me an insight into the mystery of our faith. If the season of Christmas and Epiphany reveals the wonder of God sharing his life among us and inviting us to share our lives with his, then the season of Lent unfolds the cost in human terms.

Every Holy Week since I have been ordained I make a short pilgrimage to this painting and generally sit before it for about half an hour. You can imagine my horror one year when I discovered it was on loan — 'they have taken away my Lord and I do not know where they have laid him' (!) What do I think happens when sitting before the painting. I don't know. I have to allow myself to move beyond that stage of trying to understand and glean new meaning as if succumbing to a pressure to have something to show for the time. What I can say with confidence is



know the time is used. We're often in a rush trying to fit in as much as we can. This painting has taught me to slow down and wait.

This Friday the Church celebrates the Feast of Candlemas. It's when the season of Christmas draws to a conclusion and the focus of the Church's liturgical looks towards the mystery of Lent. The Gospel for Candlemass recalls the faith of Simeon and Anna who waited in the Temple and trusted that they would see for themselves the child who would save the people from their sin.

The Mass is celebrated here at St Paul's at 7:00pm this Friday on Candlemass and I encourage you to come. It may not be your usual practice to come to mass during the course of the week, but I promise you it will add both depth and colour to the practice of your faith.
