

Spiritual Disciplines



I remember in 1988 when Dallas Willard's surprising book was first published: The Spirit of the Disciplines: **Understanding How God Changes** *Lives.* Part of the surprise was that Dallas Willard (1935 - 2013) was a Southern Baptist Minister and this book was certainly not typical of their 'discipleship' style. Also, I had only read Dallas Willard in areas touching on my own research interests at that time in the philosophy of science – he was an Academic Philosopher (working at the University of South California) concerned with phenomenology and epistemology. Together with theologians like Pastor Richard Foster (an evangelical Quaker and founder of Renovaré) he was part of a new wave of spiritual writers who tried to renew the historic place of Christian spirituality, evident in the wider church, in the lives of evangelicals.

It's still a good book (now on kindle) and his approach appeals to many who want practical examples and

'exercises' rooted in the traditions of the mothers and fathers of the church, traditions which help us to become better Christians, better more fulfilled human beings, made in the image of God.

The spiritual disciplines are exercises which we can do at any time, but for which Lent provides an added impetus. Traditionally the church has seen the Disciplines of Abstinence as controlling the normal desires: food, sleep, bodily activity, companionship, curiosity, sex; and also the subtler desires: convenience, comfort, material security, reputation, fame and variety. Here are the primary disciplines of the Via Negativa: Solitude: Silence: Fasting: Frugality: Chastity; Secrecy; Sacrifice; Vigil; (Suffering); Rest. Some of them are intriguing and you'll have to do some research and reading (see 'Study' below!) if you want to know what they are - or ask me over a modest coffee!

Then there are the more positive **Disciplines of Engagement** which are to channel our gifts and creativity; the *Via Positiva*: Study; Worship; Celebration; Service; Prayer; Fellowship; Confession; Writing; Work.

A balanced diet of some of these disciplines over the Lenten period, and beyond, will make us healthier spiritually (and possibly physically) and prepare us for a joyful Easter.
