Highs and lows



After all the (exhausting but also energising) excitement of the great Triduum, culminating in the Alleluias of Easter morning, this Sunday feels very different. Traditionally referred to as 'Low Sunday', it is more correctly known as The Second Sunday of Easter. Why 'low' Sunday? Some say that it is simply a question of its contrast with the high solemnity of Easter Day; others believe that etymologically the name may be a corruption of the ancient sequence associated with the liturgy of the day, Laudes Salvatori voce modulemur supplici (Let us sing praises to the Saviour with humble voice). So, perhaps a mis-heard 'laudes Sunday'!

But it doesn't end there. In other parts of the tradition this is known as 'St Thomas Sunday' (on account of the gospel set for the day) and in still others as 'Quasimodo Sunday.' If you're thinking 'hunchback', then this last, most peculiar name, derives from the traditional introit at the mass of the day, *Quasi modo geniti infantes* ('therefore like new-born infants...' c.f. 1 Peter 2). Interestingly, Victor Hugo, the creator of the hunchback of the same name in his novel *The Hunchback of Notre-Dame*, so named him because Easter 2 was

the day on which his adoptive father, Archdeacon Claude Frollo, found him abandoned and took him in. Goodness, what's in a name!

The important point in all of this for Christians is that Easter is not 'over.' The secular world of the high street may even now be discounting Easter Eggs and moving on to their summer offering, but in church, Easter Day just marks the beginning of a season which runs through until Pentecost, 50 days later. This is a bright season in which we will explore together the mystery of the resurrection and that new life which God gives us in baptism. Throughout this time we will wear white at our services and 'alleluia will be our song.'

Of all the names given to this Sunday, I like Quasimodo Sunday the best. The text from 1 Peter sets our agenda and ambition for these days: Rid yourselves, therefore, of all malice, and all quile, insincerity, envy, and all slander. Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation— if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. Come to him. a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

Ready to be built anew?
