SURPRISED BY JOY



Familiarity breeds, if not contempt then indifference. While the rhythm of routine has its attractions, things we do over and over again lose their magic and their ability to surprise and delight us.

Another Christmas...another Easter... with our familiar family traditions and habits. And in church, a by-now-well-rehearsed sequence of liturgies that console us by their familiarity.

At the heart of Easter, though, is startled surprise and shock. We know that on the Third Day, Christ rises again. We have our hymns in readiness. Not so the first disciples: for them the rollercoaster of emotions from

Palm Sunday's elation and excitement, through the ominous intimacy of the Upper Room, the silence of the Garden and then Good Friday's betrayal and brutiality. And then death and loss.

Hans Holbein the Younger's Noli me tangere, for all its theological infelicities – listen to this morning's sermon for more detail! – captures the surprise of the moment of Resurrection well. As Simon Peter and the beloved disciple return to their grieving in Jerusalem (centre), Mary Magdalene is astonished, and fearful, and filled with wonder...

Can we, today, 'suspend' our foreknowledge and be filled with wonder and surprised by the joy of Easter? Let's try!
